water assessment for both allocated and non-allocated water is set at \$20.00 per acre-foot of water; and that the account service charge for irrigable land account shall be \$12.00 per owner. These assessments are due upon receipt of EPCWID notices and become delinquent on February 1, 2018.

Highway, Reconstruction of Franklin Canal heading to place canal underground is dual 6.5' X 6.5' concrete box culverts from heading to 1st Street, approximately 340' is approved.

b. Application 1925, by El Paso Water Utilities- Public Service Board, for a 25 year license to construct a 12-inch water main along the Franklin Canal's northeast right for way line adjacent to Alameda Avenue (SH-20) via open cut method.

RESOLVED: that Application 1925, by El Paso Water Utilities-Public Service Board is approved under the requirements that the Texas Department of Transportation approves in writing payments of up to \$490,000 for cost of materials to concrete pave 3,500 feet of Franklin Canal, and that the El Paso Water Utilities and condition that the applicant meets all requirements of the license, including paying all fees and costs required by the license and providing the District with three signed originals of the license, both within 60 days hereafter, and the officers of EPCWID No. 1 are authorized and directed to execute such license, a copy of which is attached hereto.

c. Application 1973, by Conterra Ultra Broadband, LLC, for a 20 year license to construct a subsurface fiber optic cable system under Franklin Canal ('an irrigation canal) at Little Flower Drive, via horizontal directional drilling, approximately Station 456+13.

After a motion by Indar Singh, seconded by Larry Ceballos, duly considered and carried by unanimous vote of the Board it was:

RESOLVED: that Application 1973, by Conterra Ultra Broadband, LLC, for a 20 year license to construct a

subsurface fiber optic cable system under Franklin Canal (an irrigation canal) at Little Flower Drive, via horizontal directional drilling, approximately Station 456+13 is approved upon the condition that the applicant meets all requirements of the license, including paying all fees and costs required by the license and providing the District with three signed originals of the license, both within 60 days hereafter, and the officers of EPCWID No. 1 are authorized and directed to execute such license, a copy of which is attached hereto.

d. Application 1975, by Conterra Ultra Broadband, LLC, for a 20 year license to construct an aerial fiber optic cable system across Playa Lateral (an irrigation canal) at Knights Drive, approximately Station 43+00

After a motion by Indar Singh, seconded by Larry Ceballos, duly considered and carried by unanimous vote of the Board it was:

RESOLVED: that Application 1975, by Conterra Ultra Broadband, LLC, for a 20 year license to construct an aerial fiber optic cable system across Playa Lateral (an irrigation canal) at Knights Drive, approximately Station 43+00 is approved upon the condition that the applicant meets all requirements of the license, including paying all fees and costs required by the license and providing the District with three signed originals of the license, both within 60 days hereafter, and the officers of EPCWID No. 1 are authorized and directed to execute such license, a copy of which is attached hereto.
